CocoRosie

The Adventures Of Ghosthorse And Stillborn TOUCHAND SO

Another peek into the remarkable twilight world of the Casady siblings.

CocoRosie's 2005 album Noah's Ark was a charming kook-fest and worthy sequel to 2004's La Maison de Mon Rêve debut in which the once estranged American Casady sisters - opera-trained Sierra; little girl-voiced Bianca leavened childlike musings with Jean Genet-derived eroticism and folk/hip hop backings with squeaky toys and fairytale caprices. Recorded in Reykjavik with Björk collaborator Valgeir Sigurdsson, The Adventures Of Ghosthorse And Stillborn dives deeper still into their cultural dressing up box. Opener Rainbow Warrlors is typically eclectic, accommodating an aria-like introduction, scratching and an irresistible

melody – think Björk covering Tom Tom Club Bloody Twins marries music boxes to witchy mewlings; Japan is a playground anthem with a dark undertow ("everybody wants to go to Iraq") and exquisite operatic interlude. Like much here, it seduces with a mixture of whimsical beauty and compelling mystery.
